

PE Sport Premium

PE and school sport play a very important part in the life at St Matthew's School. We believe that PE provides children with:

- A lifelong positive attitude to exercise and a healthy lifestyle
- Increased understanding of our Christian values of respect, friendship and achievement.
- Opportunities for sportsmanship, fair play and equality for all
- Physical skills for sporting opportunities across their Primary education and beyond
- An opportunity to experience success beyond the academic area

Our overall aim is to raise standards in PE and school sport, increasing the participation and opportunities offered to our children. We aim to provide higher quality lessons and improve learning for all. This means extra coaching for teachers as well as the children so staff are well prepared to teach a wide range of sports skills.

We have been advised by the Local Authority in Hampshire that St Matthew's will be receiving £17,790 of PE Sport Premium 2021.

Active8 P.E lesson weekly	£10,000	To improve skills during P.E lessons using specialist sports leaders to extend the number of sports experienced by all pupils	Active8 improved knowledge of children in P.E, making P.E a subject all children want to take part in. Use Activate8 sports leader to provide half class sessions to support our catch up curriculum programme.	£2,500	To give teachers smaller ratio of adults to children to provide tailored learning for all children in core subjects and P.E. This has meant more specialist half and half/1:1 teaching within lessons. This has helped achieved a 66% of children in Year 6 achieving RWM by the end of Year 6.
