## PE Sport Premium

PE and school sport play a very important part in the life at St Matthew's School. We believe that PE provides children with:

- A lifelong positive attitude to exercise and a healthy lifestyle
- Increased understanding of our Christian values of respect, friendship and achievement.
- Opportunities for sportsmanship, fair play and equality for all
- Physical skills for sporting opportunities across their Primary education and beyond
- An opportunity to experience success beyond the academic area

Our overall aim is to raise standards in PE and school sport, increasing the participation and opportunities offered to our children. We aim to provide higher quality lessons and improve learning for all. This means extra coaching for teachers as well as the children so staff are well prepared to teach a wide range of sports skills.
