



School Age Immunisation Service



What is our role?

The School Age Immunisation Service offers vaccinations to children and young people (aged 4-16) across all Hampshire schools, including those who are electively home educated.

The Service works in partnership with health professionals, children and their families to provide access to the UK childhood immunisation programme, to ensure they receive their vaccinations when they are due.

Vaccinations offered:

Flu (Live Attenuated Influenza Vaccine-Nasal Spray):

Given ages 4-16, September-December

Human Papillomavirus (known as HPV):

Given from age 12/ Year 8

Tetanus, Diphtheria, Polio (known as Td/IPV):

Given from age 13/ Year 9

Meningococcal groups A,C,W,Y (known as MenACWY):

Given from age 13/ Year 9

Measles, Mumps, Rubella (known as MMR):

Routinely given at GP Surgeries at 1 and 3-years-old

Giving consent

We will contact you when your child's vaccinations are due, with a link to an electronic consent form.

Self-consent

If we have not received a form indicating a parental decision and the vaccinations are overdue, we will complete an assessment with the young person and offer the vaccine.
